REPORT OF GOLF COMMISSION

Gardner, Mass., January 29, 1937

Mayor James A. Timpany and Members of the City Council:

Gentlemen:

We are pleased to make our first annual report on the Gardner Municipal Golf Course.

Our Course was opened for play on May 2nd, 1936, the first player to tee off being Mayor Timpany, followed by a foursome including members of the Commission. The Course was closed on October 17th, 1936.

During the season, 5,188 played at 50 cents per day, making a total income on green fees of \$2,594.00. From memberships there was received \$1,782.00, and there was a miscellaneous income of \$3.00, making a total income for the year of \$4,379.00.

Our operating expenditures were within our budget. There were, however, extraordinary and non-repeating expenditures which made the total amount spent over the receipts.

It is the judgment of the Commission that the Course can be carried on, kept up-to-date and in good condition within the income, with the exception of capital expenditures. We believe the people of the city got a great deal of pleasure from the Course.

This last fall we have completely removed the stones between No. 1 and No. 2 fairway which greatly improves play on the first two holes. We have rebuilt No. 5 tee and have procured many loads of silt from the Water Department for the rough to the right of No. 3 fairway. Three fairways have been reloaded and we now have a considerable amount of loam which was secured in the fall to take care of our needs for the coming year.

We believe that many people who have not already taken up golf in 1936 will become interested in 1937. We look forward to larger receipts in the coming year.

We wish to thank at this time the courtesy given our Commission by the different departments.

Mayor Fred E. Perry and Members of the City Council:

Gentlemen:

We are pleased to submit our annual report for the year 1937.

Our Course was opened for play on May 1, 1937, and was closed for the season on October 24, 1937.

During the season 3,014 played at 50 cents per day and 922 at 75 cents per day, making a total income on green fees of \$2,198.50. From memberships there was received \$1,945.00, making a total income of \$4,143.50 for the year.

Our operating expenditures were within our budget. There were, however, extraordinary and non-repeating expenditures, such as a tractor, which made the total amount spent over the receipts.

It is the judgment of the Commission that the Course can be carried on, kept up-to-date and in good condition within the income, with the exception of capital expenditures. We believe the people of the city derived a great deal of pleasure from the Course.

Several substantial improvements were made in the Course this past season, and it is highly rated by golfers in this section of the state.

We wish to thank at this time the courtesy given our Commission by the different departments.

We are pleased to submit our annual report for the year 1938.

Our Course was opened for play on April 18, 1938, and was closed for the season on October 30, 1938.

During the season 3,808 played at 50 cents per day and 862 at 75 cents per day, making a total income on green fees of \$2,550.50. From memberships there was received \$1,932.50, making a total income of \$4,483.00 for the year.

Our operating expenditures were within our budget, and our receipts totaled more than our appropriation. With this in mind, we feel that we had a very successful year.

During the season 3,770 played at 50 cents per day and 630 at 75 cents per day, making a total income on green fees of \$2,357.50. From memberships there was received \$1,990.00 and from locker fees \$21.00, making a total income of \$4,368.50 for the year.

Gentlemen:

We are pleased to submit our annual report for the year 1940.

Our Course was opened for play on May 5, 1940. This was about two weeks later than the opening date for 1939, and was closed for the season on November 3, 1940.

During the season 3,193 played at 50 cents per day and 300 at 75 cents per day, making a total income on green fees of \$1,821.50. From memberships there was received \$1,765.00 and from locker fees \$32.00 making a total income of \$3,618.50. Operating expenditures were within our budget.

The income from both membership and green fees was considerably less in 1940 due to a delayed opening and wet weather extending into the early summer.

The Commission feel that the 1940 season was fairly successful taking under consideration the above adverse conditions.

Gentlemen:

We are pleased to submit our annual report for the year 1942.

Our course was opened for play April 19, 1942 and was closed for the season October 12, 1942.

During the season 3,359 various persons played at 50 cents per day and 102 at 75 cents per day making a total income from greens fees \$1,756.00. From memberships, including Family, Senior and Junior fees we received \$1,367.85, and from locker fees we received \$46.00 making a total of \$3,169.85.

During the year the Commission sponsored a number of tournaments, among them Army and Navy Relief - receipts received \$22.50. Also, one for American Red Cross which netted \$25.00.

The Commission feels that the course has provided healthy adult recreation and has given an equal opportunity to the white-collar man and the man at the bench to meet each other at play, thereby uniting us more firmly in our way of life.

We also feel that consideration should be given in post war planning to the expansion of the Golf Course.

We are pleased to submit our annual report for the year 1943.

Our course was opened for play May 1, 1943 and was closed for the season October 12, 1943.

During the season 363 various persons played at 50 cents per day, and 649 at 75 cents per day making a total income from greens fees \$668.25. From memberships, including Family, Senior and Junior, we received \$760.00; and from locker fees we received \$60.00 making the total receipts for the season \$1,488.25.

The use of the course was offered, free of charge, to all members of the Armed Forces. A number of them availed themselves of the privilege.

During the year a number of tournaments were sponsored. Among them one for the Red Cross and one for the U.S.O., and the proceeds of these tournaments were turned over to the said organizations.


The use of the course was offered again for the fourth season, free of charge, to all members of the Armed Forces and 38 members took advantage of this opportunity.

The privileges of the Golf Course were offered free-of-charge to all members of the Armed Forces on any day of the week and were offered to all students of the Gardner High School every Thursday afternoon.

Donald D. Snyder & Son, Incorporated, Contractors, recently completed the building of the new Pro House and it was fully accepted by the Golf Course Commission.

The Pro House now has been placed into use and it is a definite source of great pride and favorable comment by golfers and visitors of Gardner and surrounding areas.

The Golf Course Commission gratefully acknowledges the time given by Mr. Arnold Towle of the Chairtown Lumber Company who drew the preliminary plans and specifications, and supervised the construction of the building at no cost to the Commission.

It is the long-range view of the Golf Course Commission eventually to see the development of a more diversified recreational area at the Golf Course. It has been suggested that tennis courts be established for the tennis enthusiasts of the City and that during the winter months the Pro House be used as a shelter for skiers on the slopes of the Golf Course.

The Golf Course Commission again would like to bring to public attention the immediate need of a building to house the equipment used in maintaining the Golf Course. The old shed is almost in complete ruin and is no longer suitable for this purpose.

The Golf Course is in excellent condition and because of this, the Commission feels that it has stimulated increased memberships. It is the purpose of the Commission to continue improving the Course from year to year as its funds will permit.

The Golf Course Commission wishes to commend Gusto-dian Daniel F. Don ovan and his helpers on the Course, for the efficient manner in which they perform their various duties; many times at a distinct saving to the City where repairs and maintenance of the equipment is necessary.

As in the past we extended golfing privileges to members of the clergy and the armed forces. Golfing enthusiasts of the Gardner High School were extended privileges of the course and also the golf team entertained their visiting teams.

An ever increasing number of members took greater advantage of the course this past year and the course received more wear than ever before in its history. This was partially due to the increased number of shop leagues that were organized.

New tees have been started to relieve the increased wear on the old tees. An alternating program for tee use will be started

this year in order to give the tees a much needed rest.

The course experienced a general conditioning which resulted in removal of rocks, brush and undesirable trees. Several drainages were constructed and repaired so as to increase the condition of play.

The sum appropriated for construction of the tool shed foundation was expended and completion of the work is anticipated for the ensuing year.

The showers were installed as planned and it is generally agreed that this resulted in considerable benefit to the members.

Much greater play is anticipated for the coming year and as a result thereof the maintenance problems will increase in proportion to the use that the course will receive.

The clubhouse has been open for the use of the winter sports enthusiasts and the citizens of Gardner received this particular phase of our program warmly.

The Air Force has been granted the use of the clubhouse as an observation station and the program is currently in operation.

The members of the Golf Course Commission and staff wish to take this opportunity to thank the Mayor, the City Council, and the other City Departments that have cooperated so fully with us this past year. Such cooperation has resulted in greater enjoyment to the citizens of our city.

Considerable work was done to improve and speed up play at the course. Trees were planted between #1 and #3 fairway for about 250 yards and all ditches were cleaned of dirt and leaves. At #4 the wall around Crystal Lake was rebuilt due to high water and wash outs and the roadway regraveled. At #5 the left side of the fairway was cleared of brush, also some extra work was done on the green that has caused a lot of trouble in the past years. The sand traps on the right side of the green were refilled to speed up play. At #6 the rear of the green was cleared of brush. Trees that the brush was cleared from both sides of the foot of the hill. Trees that extended over the greens and the sand traps were removed. At #8 the brush and pine trees were trimmed at and around the rock pile and at #9 the brush and trees were cleared out between #9 tee and #4 tee down and around the hill.

During the year a special appropriation of \$2,000.00 was passed for the construction of additional holes. The additional hole, located in the rear of #1 green extending to the rear of #2 tee approximately 165 yards long, is now near completion. The tee and green has been built and seeded, drainage and ditches across the fairway improved. This hole should be ready for play in the latter part of the summer.

Trees and stumps have been removed from one fairway and part of another on the two additional holes that run from the rear of #5 tee back to what was known as Kendall's Ice House and return from that place to the west side of #5 fairway.

Considerable work was done to improve the playing conditions of the course during the year. All sand traps were cleaned and refilled with new sand. One sand trap on the right hand side of #2 & #5 hole was removed and another on the left hand side of #7 was also removed. The big mound on hole #6 was removed. All dead wood and brush was cleared from around the lake and also between hole #6 and Eaton Street.

During the year, three additional holes were completed. The City Council also approved \$1,000. for a survey and for the drawing of plans for the additional six holes which the Commission hopes to eventually construct.

Plans are being made now for city officials, Board of Public Health, Public Works Board and the Golf Commission to meet with state health officials to see what can be done to have these additional holes completed.

During the past year, as in other years, we permitted all members of the armed services, who are residents of the City of Gardner, to play free. This privilege was also accorded to members of the clergy and to members of the Gardner High School Golf Team. We would like to thank the members for their fine co-operation during the season.

In conclusion, the Golf Course Commission wishes to thank the Mayor, City Council and all municipal departments for the co-operation which has been received during the past year. Many thanks as well to Theresa Canu for her faithful service.

The season opened on April 21st and closed on October 31st.

Probably the most important development at the course during 1965 was the fact that money was appropriated for the sinking of an artesian well for use in watering the greens. Because of the water ban in 1964 the greens were almost ruined for lack of moisture. It is very doubtful that they would have survived another season under the same conditions. As a result of this private source of water, the greens were maintained in better condition than they had been for many years.

Another significant event was the establishment of a new ordinance whereby the five-man Golf Commission was abolished and a three-man commission was established by the City Council. It was hoped that the change would create a body which could operate more fluidly and more effectively. The members of the new commission were confirmed by the City Council on November 15th.

The third significant event in the history of the Golf Course took place on December 30th. On that day, the Mayor sent to the City Council a money order for \$25,000.00 to be taken from available cash. The purpose of this money order was the expansion of the Golf Course to a full 18 hole course. This was the first of two steps establishing a fund for the building of six additional holes. The balance of the money was to be raised in the tax levy in 1966. The order was passed unanimously.

With the prospect of an 18 hole course, the Commission foresees the need for much new equipment to maintain the course in good condition, especially in view of the poor condition of the equipment now in use. It is hoped that some workable arrangement can be made to purchase the needed equipment on a planned basis.

The Commission wishes to thank the Mayor, the City Council and the various municipal departments for their assistance and cooperation in helping make 1965 a successful year.

We will attempt to have the entire course in operation by mid-season to enlarge our capacity for increased recreation in the city.

The Gardner Golf Course Commission respectfully submits their annual report for the year 1972.

Memberships totaled 400, a decrease of 9 from the previous year.

Greens Fees during the year were as follows:

- 2678 Resident Greens Fees
- 2238 Non-Resident Greens Fees

A total of 49 Complementary Memberships were issued this year to the Golden Agers, Past Commissioners and Servicemen. Approximately 1,000 Golfers played 30,000 rounds of Golf.

Receipts for this year were: \$43,081.50
 Expenditures were: 44,980.57
 Cost to the Taxpayers: 1,899.07

This cost could have been avoided if the 14th Green was constructed in the early part of 1972 instead of in the fall of 1972 when the price was increased by approximately \$1,900.00 and the late start of the Golfing season due to the very wet weather we had which delayed the opening by about three weeks.

The decrease in revenue this year of about \$3,000.00 from last year was due to the late starting of the Golfing season and the fact that only seventeen holes were playable the entire year, due to the 14th Green not being completed until late in the fall. The Golf Course would have operated on a break even basis and at no cost to the city taxpayers if the weather had cooperated and the 14th Green completed in the spring instead of the fall at a savings of approximately \$1,900.00.

During the year in addition to ordinary maintenance, the following projects were started, planting of trees between No. 5 and 6 Fairways, widening and lengthening of No. 2, 3, and 15 Tees, and the filling and grading of the 4th Fairway. No major projects were undertaken as there were no funds allowed to the Commission for this. The Commission believes that if the revenue of the Golf Course each year, was allowed the Commission for the following year, the Golf Course could be maintained in good fashion and money could be saved and put aside for the purchase of much needed new equipment without asking for any appropriation from the City. The Golfers are now supporting the Course at no expense to the City taxpayers and we firmly believe that this money should be spent for the operation of the Course.

The Golf Course was used by the residents of Gardner for winter recreation under the supervision of the Recreation Department as in the past year.

The Commission is of the opinion that the Golf Course was maintained in substantially good condition for play throughout the year, except for the inconvenience caused by the rebuilding of the 14th Green.

The Commission would like to thank the Service Committee of the City Council, City Auditor, Purchasing Agent, City Solicitor, City Council, and other Departments for their cooperation during the year.
